By Customer I use this book almost every day because I'm a rabbinical student. Entries in Aramaic show translation into Hebrew and English, and vice versa for entries in Hebrew. The examples are usually helpful too. Occasionally he'll explain a phrase in a way that's not necessarily accurate for the text you're learning, but chances are it's accurate for other places in Talmud. This book works as a guide for the key words, phrases, and expressions of the Gemarrah. It translates each word in a way which can be easily applied to the text in various contexts, and then goes on to explain how the word is used, and how it influences the structure and logic of the Gemarrah. It is important to note that this book is not a complete dictionary of every word in the Gemarrah, rather a guide for those who are starting out and need basic guidance.
