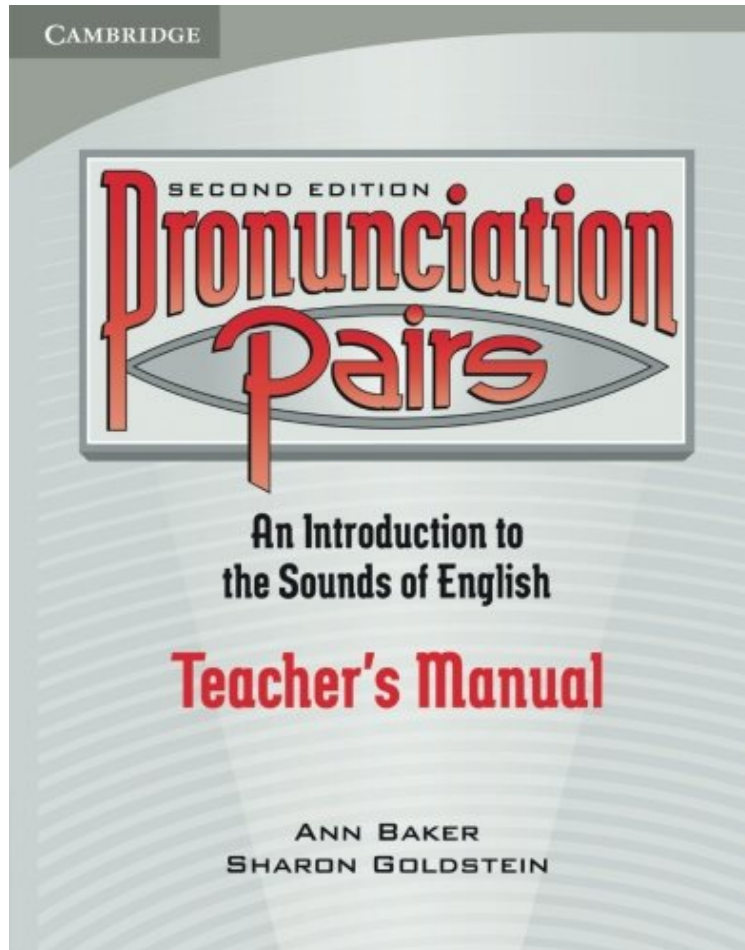


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Pronunciation Pairs: An Introduction to the Sounds of English, Teacher's Manual
