Barham As I believe others have said, this map proved not only invaluable, but nearly essential on Sint Maarten (St. Martin) since the maps on the island, generally free and full of advertizing, are largely useless and horribly incomplete if you are going to venture from town to town or across the island. We had a rental car, which I consider essential if you're planning to stay more than a day or two. This also meant we needed a good map that covered the whole island. This map fit the requirements. Even if we had a GPS unit, which we did not, we would have still wanted this map for a very helpful overview of the whole road system on the island and what routes we wanted to take ...sometimes taking alternate routes to switch things up when we visited towns or beaches for a second or third time. As another reviewer

also said, the downside of the this map is that the paper is rather low quality and weak, so though it's scant thickness means it folds well and isn't too heavy, it began to develop tears at fold intersections by just the 4th or 5th day of careful use. So the 20 dollar price is rather painful and not a great value compared to other maps, but I suspect it is printed in pretty low quantities and given how valuable it was, I would not hesitate to recommend it if you're planning a trip to St. Barth or St. Martin. If you'll be navigating a rental vehicle on your trip, I would consider this map essential!

Car Rental Tip- We went everywhere and saved a lot of money vs. having used a local taxi. A super short (1 mile ?) jaunt from our hotel to the nearby town center was about \$12 (USD) one way. Our car was about \$37 per day, which we routinely drove from one end of the island to another, sometimes twice daily. Don't rent at your hotel, but rather at one of the well known agencies located near the airport. You'll save money and get better cars. We had a Nissan 01 visa which proved to have plenty of power, GREAT air conditioning (a must) and was really quite nice to drive, not to mention fuel miserly. DO NOT get the Hyundai I10 if you can possibly avoid it, which I had on St. Barth for a day...totally inadequate power for the hills, Air conditioning miserably under-powered - meaning you have a sweaty, uncomfortable day ahead of you.
