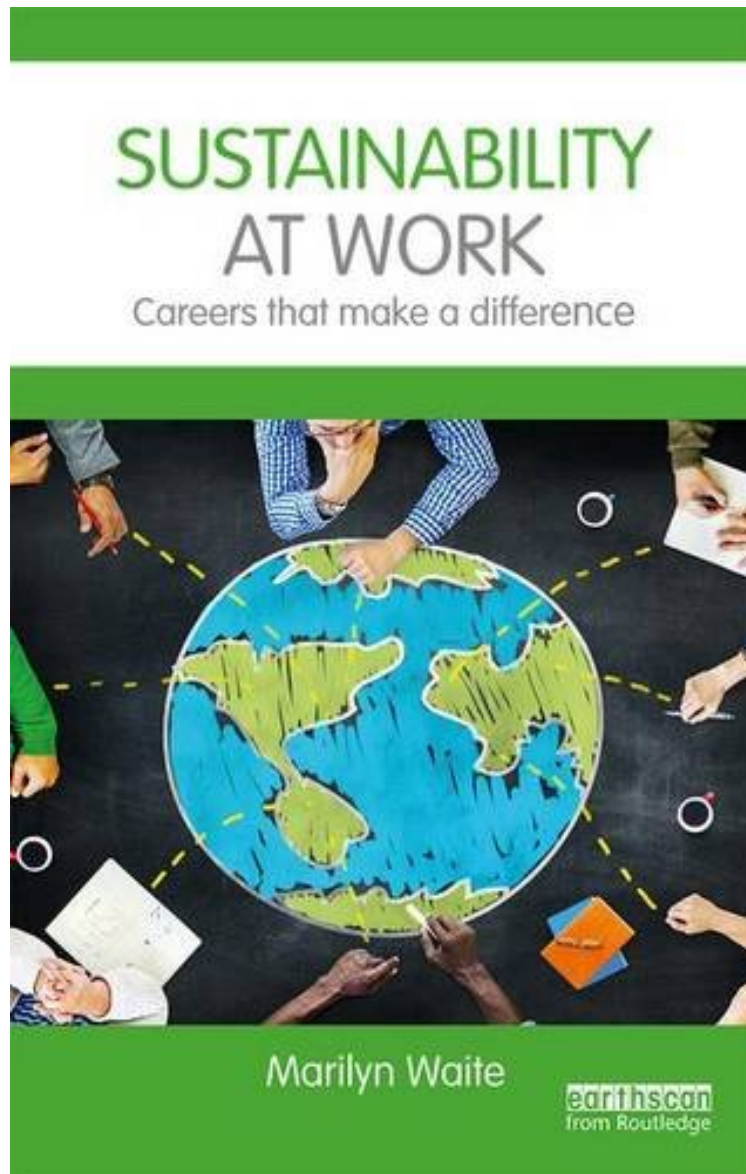


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Sustainability at Work: Careers that make a difference

This book takes an issue that's complicated both emotionally and logistically and incorporates environmental and social sustainability into a career and lays it out in a very clear and optimistic way. Waite immediately sets out her central thesis, that sustainability is achievable in any kind of career, and continues on to provide examples. She starts by defining sustainability, providing a handy four-pillar framework (Environmental, Social, Economic, and Intergenerational) to think about it through. She goes on to relate the history of sustainability practices becoming increasingly incorporated into various lines of business, and then devotes several chapters to different career fields, providing examples of how individuals in each field incorporated sustainability into their work. These fields include science, healthcare, law, business, education, and entertainment. What stands out most about Waite's book is her continual optimism. For her, sustainability is not merely an ideal, nor is it an unfortunate necessity. It is an achievable, valuable, desirable reality. She takes on an inspirational tone that carries the reader along through her explanations of ways to create a world that is good not only for us today but for people in the future. She challenges the reader to figure out how they are contributing to that creation, but at the same time discusses this challenge as though it is not truly that difficult, turning a conversation that many people choose to avoid thinking about into a concept that is accessible to all. Waite backs up her optimism with concrete examples of individuals all over the world and in all lines of business who have taken the goal of sustainability to heart and discovered a fulfilling life along the way, and their stories contribute to her inspiration of the reader. When Waite concludes her book with a simple order, *Now act*, it hits with the impact of a call to action much larger than two three-letter words.

SUSTAINABILITY AT WORK is a comprehensive, strong look at how achieving sustainability in your career or business is not only possible, but profitable and helpful to both society and the environment. Whether you're switching jobs, starting a business, or looking for a career fresh out of school, or are working your current nine-to-five, this book has something to say to you. What I found refreshing was the lack of preachiness, as is common in books of this variety. Instead, it instilled a sense of excitement even in a person like me, who wants to help the environment but isn't going to make it my sole mission in life. Helping the planet and its people doesn't have to be a massive green operation but can be implemented in small ways. As a business owner myself, I'll have to admit, learning that a green operation could also be a profitable one in the long run was a selling point for me. This book first struck me as incredibly well researched, with strong sources and rounded perspectives. Yet it's not long-winded or full of impressive language designed to elevate it above its audience. The tone is clear, professional, and informative but also with a friendly edge that made it easy reading, not just educational. If you're happy with your current job, then don't be afraid this book isn't for you. It offers a new perspective along with actionable missions you can accomplish within your own industry. If you're a student considering your future career, then this is definitely a book which will provide a strong look at the current state of sustainability, which industries face the most roadblocks or the most progress (so you can choose where you'd make the most difference or what you can contribute once you get there), as well as a philosophical look at what sustainability could mean for you.
