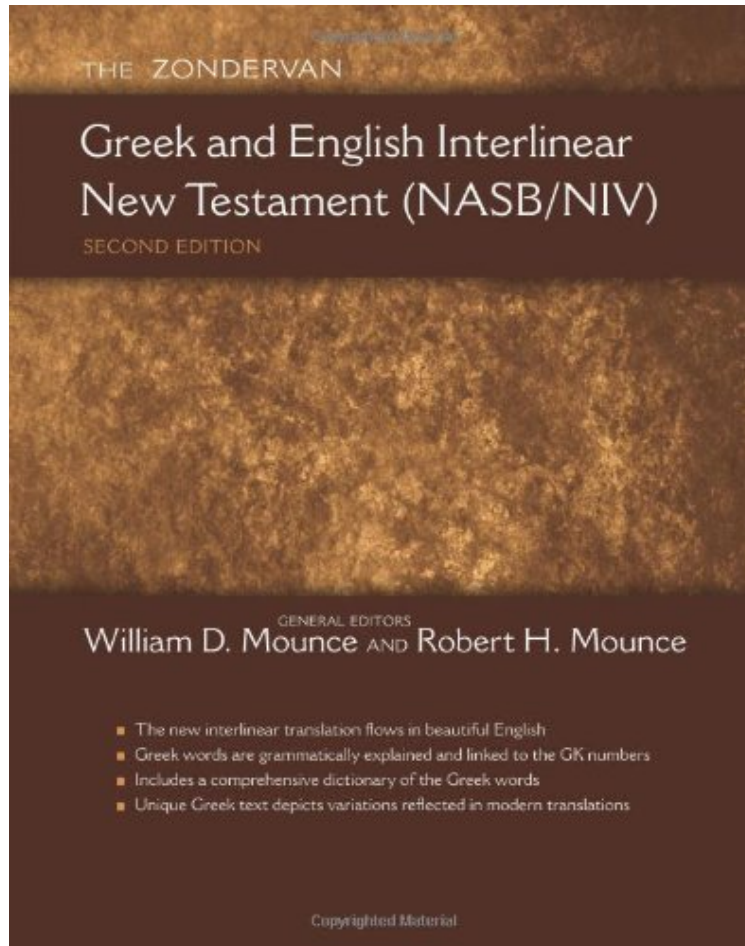

Recommended for Greek practice - use with an index card By Julie Newberry I just finished taking a summer course in biblical Greek, and this interlinear has been a great way for me to reinforce and expand my learning, without becoming discouraged. In terms of layout: The book has three columns. The outer columns have the NIV and NASB, which are useful for comparison. The largest, central column has the Greek text (with occasional, very brief footnotes about differences in how modern editions of the Greek handle particular textual issues). Each word is parsed, which is very helpful for the beginning (or rusty) Greek student. The central column also includes an English translation. This uses italics and other marking devices to indicate the meaning of

each Greek word while also offering a smooth English translation of the sentence. Each word is numbered with numbers that correspond to a lexicon at the back of the book, making it easy to look up words whose lexical form may be unfamiliar. Since the translation of a word in a given verse is sometimes fairly context-specific, it's often worth the trouble of looking a new word up in this lexicon (and other, more standard lexicons--if you have time and access to them). Consulting the NIV's and NASB's treatment of the word can be helpful for this purpose as well, which is another reason why it's great to have those outside columns included. Advice for use: It would be easy to use this book as a crutch, never actually learning Greek vocab and parsing. To resist that temptation, I've found it very helpful to read with an index card, covering up the translation and parsing lines of the text while I work through the Greek. That way, I test my knowledge of vocab and grammar, and whenever I feel like I've struggled with it enough, I uncover the other lines to check myself and fill in gaps in my knowledge. Of course, when I'm reading for a class, I'll use the NA-27 and consult grammars and lexicons like I'm supposed to do. And eventually I'll probably buy Bibleworks, which has many additional, helpful features. But for extra practice on my own, reading this interlinear with an index card has been very useful, enabling me to practice Greek without feeling overwhelmed (or spending several hundred dollars on Bibleworks).

Good Product But Print Too Small By Angell I studied Greek with the Mounce textbooks, workbooks and DVD's, so I was looking forward to using this interlinear new testament written by him. It is everything I could have wanted except that some of the print was too small for me to read and some of it was such light grey ink. If you can read small light print comfortably, this interlinear is a very fine product as are all of Bill Mounce's books. It's the best interlinear that I have seen. By Mr. Michael Johnson This interlinear was produced by Bill Mounce with considerable help from his father Robert. It uses the original Greek word order but Robert has inserted the English translation of the words where they would be in normal writing. I find this works very well. The NIV and NASB translations are also given for comparison. Each Greek word used is given its GK number (see The NIV Exhaustive Bible Concordance, Third Edition: A Better Strong's Bible Concordance). At the end of the book there is a Greek-English dictionary of each word which shows how it is translated in other parts of the New Testament. More detail can be found in Mounce's Complete Expository Dictionary of Old and New Testament Words. There is even more information in New International Dictionary of New Testament Theology: Abridged Edition. The first line is the original Greek word. The second is the English translation and the third the G/K number. The fourth line gives you the case, number and gender of the noun, or the person, number, tense, voice and mood of the verb. Bill Mounce is the President and Founder of Biblical Training and he also has a helpful web site. Those who do not require such an advanced interlinear should consider Interlinear for the Rest of Us: The Reverse Interlinear for New Testament Word Studies. The book is 24 cm high, 20 cm deep, 6 cm wide and weighs 2.22 KG. There are 1,200 pages and the print is small but I think Zondervan have achieved the right balance to keep the size manageable. I would have preferred to purchase a Kindle edition so I could use it at church on my tablet.
