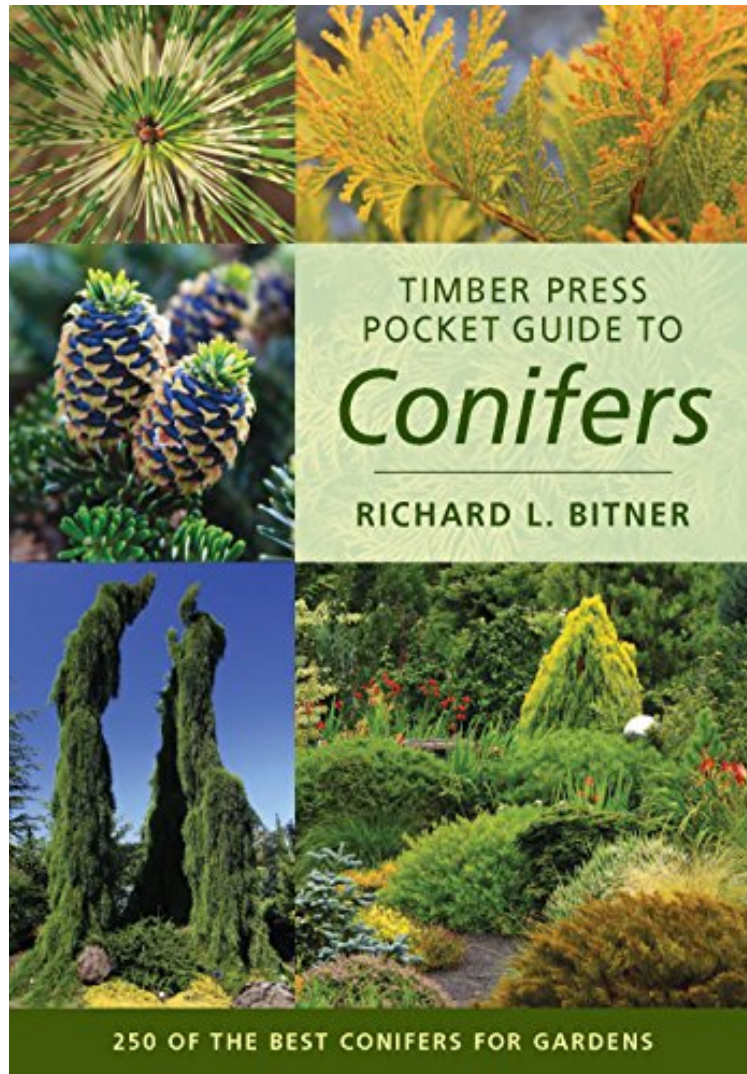

I would like this book to be an ordering catalog w/out prices instead of your typical field guide. The pictures are very generic, and there's almost zero identifying information. Essentially the information reads like
