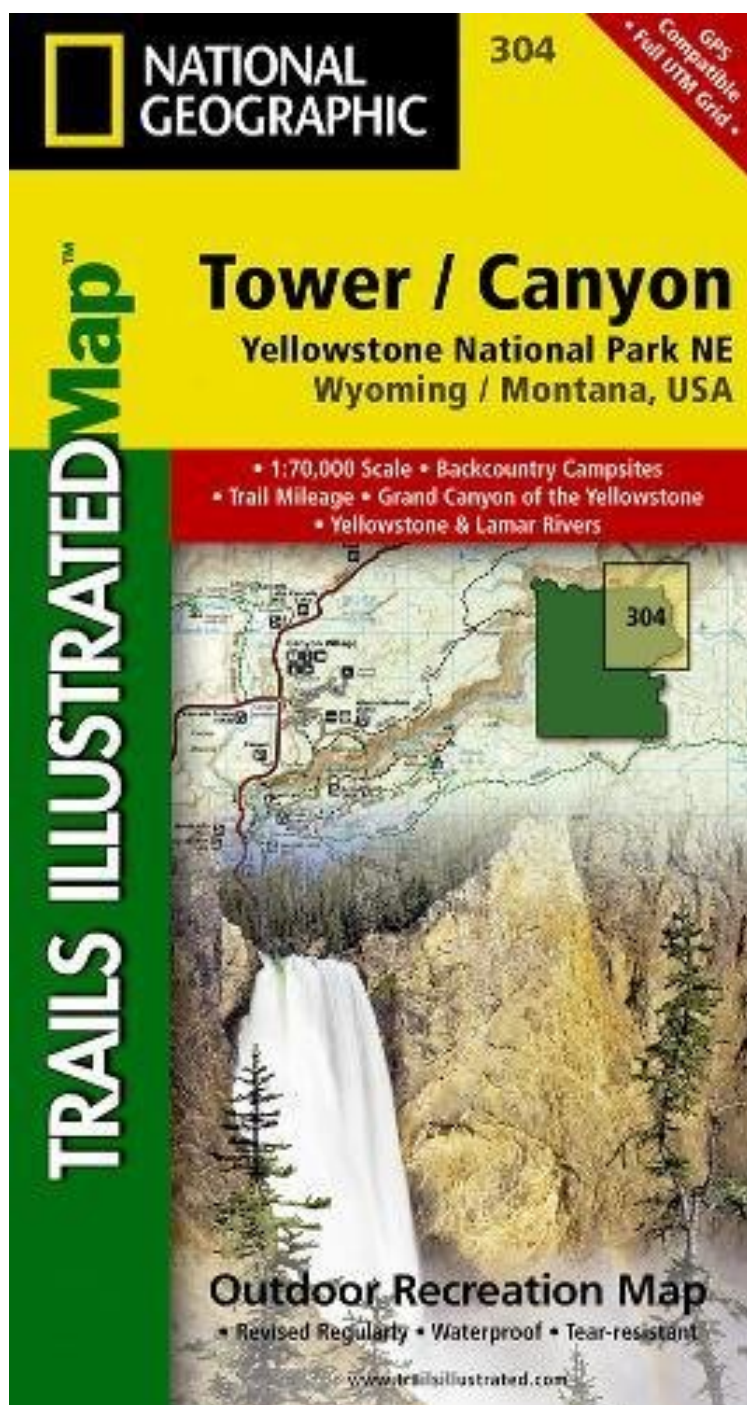

Unlike many Yellowstone maps, this one has the campsites clearly labeled. It also shows trail mileage. An important map to have if you're hiking in the backcountry and we used it many times. We camped along Cache Creek, the Lamar River, and the Slough, all of which are on this map. It was totally helpful. Yellowstone trails are as a whole very clearly marked, but this gave us a way to think about entering the water to fish by leaving trails, and allowed us to plan when to leave the river to return to the camp (often an hour or more walk back in the evening). Also the map is water- and tear-resistant which is very nice. It may not be the toughest map, but it should withstand most typical hiking trips. Contour lines - totally necessary for a hiking map - are 50 ft.
