Well-designed, Facilitates In-Depth NT Word StudyBy ReaderHall notice that another reviewer complains of a complication in searching for a word because access was only via the first letter. While the TOC offers access by alphabet, the quickest way to find a word is to simply to type it - usually you'll see your word in the menu which pops up after just two or three letters, then click on your word and there you are (or better still, set as default dictionary and it's there with one click!). Very quickly. And the feature works just fine on my older Kindle Keyboard, which isn't always the case due to some software change Kindle made that I don't even begin to understand.I also have the International Standard Bible Encyclopedia on my Kindle; I have been using that as my default dictionary but now, depending on my need, I change back and forth between these two (Vine's ISBE. I assume most of you have the ISBE since it is virtually free, and is also one of the best bible dictionaries ever published - a 4-

volume set in one; if you don't have it, get it). In conjunction with the excellent "King James Study Bible [Annotated]" (see my review there), which includes Strng's Exhaustive Concordance with his Greek and Hebrew dictionaries, this makes a pretty powerful set of well-designed, quickly navigable tools on the cheap. The Vine's is more in-depth and detailed than Strong's Greek dictionary. The ISBE provides a wealth of general bible and theological info for when you aren't doing word studies; which puts the info at your fingertips for any (esp KJV as regards Vine's)) bible when set as default - the best way to use them, in my experience, since it doesn't require closing one book and opening another. (Though you do have to do so in order to change the default setting.) To be honest, I had thought serious bible study using Kindle was either impossible or hopelessly time-consuming and undoable until I found these well-designed selections which work together seamlessly. Now Kindle has become my favorite way to study - not merely to read - the bible, though I admit that, if I had a laptop PC, I'm sure I'd use eSword more. {If I sparked anyone's interest in the KJV bible mentioned above, then make sure you note the title exactly (or copy and paste) because there are several with similar titles, and not all are created equal - not by a long shot. I'm not associated with any publisher or ebook designer, just a user of their products.}

I've studied the Sacred Writings for many years. In doing so, I've used as many as 9 different Bible versions, 3 different Greek New Testaments, and some of the most trusted concordances and Greek lexicons available (Strong's, Young's, Thayer's, Moulton's, Bauer, and others). And Vine's Expository Dictionary of New Testament Words was right there with them. I turned to it over and over, and it was invaluable to me in doing word studies and teaching Bible classes some 30 yrs ago. I've heard some people say that they dislike the book because of the layout of the text, with headings and subheadings centered on each page, rather than in the usual left-right margin format. This, of course, varies from person to person. As for me, I love the format of the text. I also love the use of all-capital letters and bold type for quick identification and easy readability. And I love reading Vine's own frequent comments on the meaning and application of the words. His grasp of the Holy Scriptures and of the Greek is at once evident to all. I believe that doing word studies of the Bible is not an option, but rather is required... particularly, word studies of the Greek... if one intends to "grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ." The copy of Vine's work that I had long ago, I probably either gave to the church library or to the mission work in Africa, because there is a constant shortage of Bibles and study helps there. But missing the book so much after all these years, when I saw the unabridged version for sale here on , I grabbed it! And I don't intend to give it up again. And now, 30+ years later, I can see why I loved this book so much back then and why it was such a tremendous help in preparing my Bible lessons.
