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The Cuaderno de actividades (Workbook/Laboratory Manual) to accompany *Tu mundo* links culture to the main text and to students' lives. Both the *Escribelo t* and the *Conexin* cultural sections are introduced in the *Tu mundo* main text and fully explored in the Cuaderno, thus offering exciting cultural content linked to the Spanish-speaking world. The Cuaderno addresses writing, listening comprehension, speaking, and reading practice: writing activities integrate and reinforce the content presented in the corresponding chapter of the main text; an interactive blog where the characters from *Amigos sin Fronteras* post comments on current events serves as a springboard for student and teacher written participation; and *Enlace auditivo* which includes two listening segments that include dialogues, ads, and announcements.

Jeanne Egasse Received her B.A. and M.A. in Spanish linguistics from the University of California, Irvine. She has taught foreign language methodology courses and supervised foreign language and ESL teachers in training for the Department of Education at the University of California, Irvine. Currently, she is an instructor of Spanish and coordinates the Spanish language Program at Irvine Valley College. In addition, Professor Egasse serves as a consultant for local schools and universities on implementing Natural Approach in the language classroom.
