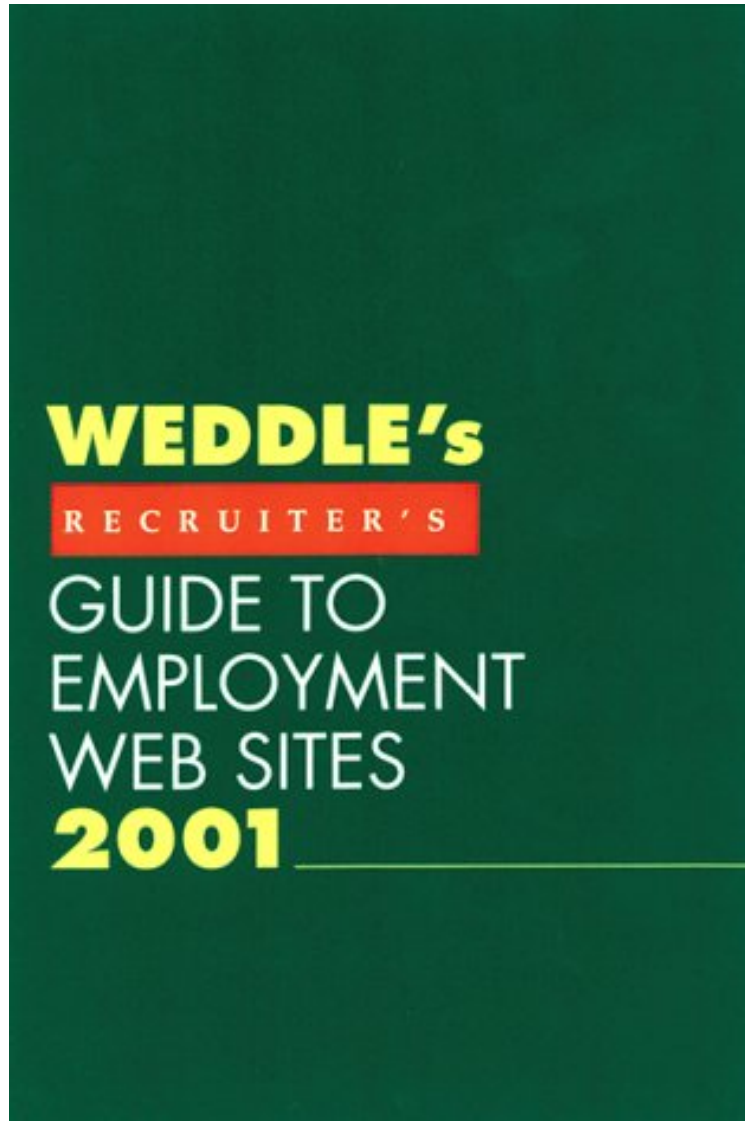

If you have a vague sense that a site exists but don't remember its name, you can probably find it here. If you're totally new to the web or online job hunting, this book won't explain it to you. It doesn't evaluate the sites, or even structure the presentation in any meaningful way--the listing is alphabetic. What it lacks in

analysis, it makes up in breadth. It's a quick, mostly accurate, overview of 250 job websites.

This guide presents the most popular resources for locating high-calibre job candidates. The recruiter can find out answers to questions like: Which sites are people really using?, Which specialize in engineering, accounting or IT people? or Which sites are worthwhile and which are a waste of time? The book includes features like site profile, a cross-reference index and a five step process for selecting web sites.
